Get Money Back On Your Home

- Age 65+ and earned \$33,800 or under in 2022?
- Disabled and earned \$33,800 or under in 2022?

Then you could be eligible for property tax relief and get money back in your pocket!

North Carolina's Elderly or Disabled Exclusion program provides property tax relief for qualifying homeowners at least 65 years of age or those totally and permanently disabled. The Disabled Veteran Exclusion program has no age or income limitation and provides relief specifically for disabled veterans, and the surviving spouses (who have not remarried) of servicemembers or veterans.
